## 1. The Church:

- e. Let Believers have a biblical world view. Help them learn to LOVE the Word of God.
- f. Strengthen the Church to LOVE our cities and people and churches like You have loved us.
- g. Protection: We pray protection over THE CHURCH, to take a reasonable and bold stand and not bow to pressure. Wise as serpents, gentle as doves.

## 2. Education:

- a. Pray for Neakahnie, Tillamook and Nestucca School Boards to discern, have wisdom and to make decisions which will be healthy for our children and to provide a structure conducive to learning. "Health Clinic" which does not require parental permission at Neakahnie HS to educate and treat children for gender transitioning and other things. Nestucca HS is considering a "Health Clinic"
- b. Search is on for new Superintendents for Tillamook and Neakahnie School Districts.
- c. We pray for healthy and stable family life for every child, with adequate support & supervision.
- d. Let our parents take an active role in advocating for education and their children. Help parents speak up regarding philosophies which go against God's Word. Parent rights!
- e. Pray for Senator Suzanne Weber as she is Vice Chair on the State Education Committee. Help her to bring common sense education back to Oregon laws.Christian Schools: SDA, God's Lighthouse, Ocean Breeze Baptist, Pacific Christian, Tillamook Christian Center, Life Change Fellowship
- f. Let every young child excel in their foundations in reading, writing and arithmetic. Prepare their hearts and minds like a sponge and help them focus. Peaceful classrooms. Help our senior students persevere and graduate.

# 3. Health Care:

- a. Staffing of nurses and other medical professions is at crisis levels making hospital beds unavailable. (Continues to be a problem). Part of the problem is housing.
- b. Teen Pregnancies 1 in10-17 age, 17 in 18-19 age in 2022. Of all babies born, 45.9% are born are to single parents (higher).
- c. 2022 Oregon drug overdose death doubled... Drugs are being cut with other lethal products. In 2022 there were 15 Unintentional injury/death (Unintentional injuries include opioid overdoses (unintentional poisoning), motor vehicle crashes, and unintentional falls
- d. Depression, 8 Suicides, 2 Homicides (sudden increase 11 suicides in 2021, 2 homicides), overdosing on drugs (common in 2021, better this year in Tillamook Co.).
- e. 35 Abortions reported for the year in Dec. Pray for State of Oregon who has opened doors and tax payer funding to anyone wanting abortion without restriction even outside the state..

- f. The International Healing Rooms for Prayer have been set up in Garibaldi. Working on setting up a team in Tillamook. Many praise reports.
- 4. Family: Restore divisions in families. Strengthen bonds of loyalty and peace.
  - a. Presence of God: Flood our homes with the Presence of God. Let there be an explosion of revelation of goodness and leading families with love, strength, discipline, compassion.
  - b. Inflation 8.2% increase in 2022: Let there be more than enough work with money sufficient to meet the rising costs. 440 unemployed or 4.9% of Tillamook Co.. 14.6% of pop. In poverty
  - c. Protection and deliverance from isolation, depression, addictions and domestic violence. Put a desire to go to church and help the churches be equipped to minister effectively to help.
  - d. Homelessness Estimate 2019 of 184 people in Tillamook Co. , Poverty, Jobs
  - e. Housing shortages /Expensive Rent. 70.3% homes are occupied, the rest are vacation homes.

#### 5. Business: Current Unemployment rate is 4.9%

- a. Healthy, holy family values to prevail in all businesses: In 2021 Tillamook Co. Marijuana sales are #6 in the state. \$279 avg./per resident! This is down from 2021 \$343 avg/person
- b. Main Street beginning to remodel and renovate. Sustain businesses during renovation.
- c. Stabilize Inflation and supply lines and adequate employees to maintain business.
- d. Financial stability...help people to shop locally. Praise: Many new, attractive shops!
- e. Tourism and fishing to rebound with prosperity. Disease in oyster beds to be healedbusinesses have closed.

## 6. Government:

- a. New council members, Senator, Representatives being sworn in. Let them get started well. We pray for all our leaders conduct to be above and not beneath, no backbiting or behind the scenes politicking. Bring much needed unity and strength to seek the best for their city.
- b. Election Integrity several races are not resolved. Let the problems be resolved.
- c. Oregon State Rep. Cyrus Javadi, Suzanne Bonamici
