PRAY FOR:

1. The Church:

PRAISE: Breakthrough Worship Night 5th Sunday- Awesome worship!!!

- a. Let the Church AWAKEN! Let the Church carry a torch of LOVE! Let every Believer begin to share the good news and bring people to salvation.
- b. Let strong, righteous Believers take positions of leadership in every sphere of culture
- c. Discipleship: Let every new Believer get planted and growing in the Body of Christ, strengthened to fight the good fight of faith, reproducing new Believers.
- d. Let Believers have a biblical world view. Help them learn to LOVE the Word of God.
- e. **P.A.T.H. Prayer at the Heart of Tillamook County September 16**
- f. Pastors, spouses and Leaders- refreshing, endurance to run the race, Joy of the Lord, protection from every demonic assault and from burn out.
- g. Let our pastors and Churches love and respect each other.

2. Education:

- a. Pray for Neakahnie, Tillamook and Nestucca School Boards to discern, have wisdom and to make decisions which will be healthy for our children and to provide a structure conducive to learning. (Pray for your community's school board – listed on Page 4).
- b. Test Scores are significantly below state averages in all county High Schools in English & Math
- c. For summer, healthy and stable family life for every child, with adequate support & supervision.
- d. Let parents take an active role and successful role in advocating for education and their children. Pray for our teachers, natural discipline, navigate subject matter with holiness.
- e. Pray for Senator Suzanne Weber as she is Vice Chair on the State Education Committee. Help her bring common sense education back to Oregon laws. Oregon legislature is promoting State controlled education this session.

3. Health Care:

Praise: Embrace Grace is helping single women before & after birth

- a. Teen Pregnancies 0 in 10-17 age, 2 in 18-19 age in 2022. Of all babies born, 49.1% are born to single parents (higher) so far in 2023 29 married, 28 unmarried
- b. 2022 Oregon drug overdose death doubled... Drugs are being cut with other lethal products. In 2022 there were 13 death by overdose in Tillamook Co.
- c. In 2023 Depression, 6 Suicides, 1 Homicides Serious traumatic accidents on our highways.
- d. 3 Abortions reported for the year first quarter. Pray for State of Oregon who has opened doors and tax payer funding to anyone wanting abortion without restriction even outside the state..
- e. The International Healing Rooms for Prayer have been set up in Garibaldi. Working on setting up a new team in Tillamook. Many praise reports.

4. Family: Praise: More housing solutions coming, More mini-homes for those transitioning out of homelessness.

- a. Restore divisions in families. Strengthen bonds of loyalty and peace. Put Christ at the center!
- b. Presence of God: Flood our homes with the Presence of God. Let there be an explosion of revelation of goodness and leading families with love, strength, discipline, compassion. Pray for those struggling. Help the church provide wise and effective marriage counseling.

- c. Inflation/adjusted income rate is 2.9% below state average. Let there be more than enough work with money sufficient to meet the rising costs. 79 unemployed or 2.9% of Tillamook Co.. 14.6% of pop. In poverty
- d. Protection and deliverance from isolation, depression, addictions and domestic violence. Put a desire to go to church and help the churches be equipped to minister effectively to help.
- e. Homelessness Estimate 2019 of 184 people in Tillamook Co. , #2 in the state/capita Poverty.
- f. Housing shortages /Expensive Rent. 70.3% homes are occupied, the rest are vacation homes.

5. Business: Current Unemployment rate is 2.9% (improvement) Praise: Many new, attractive shops! People to bless and shop locally!

- a. Healthy family values to prevail in all businesses: In 2022 Tillamook Co. Marijuana sales are #6 in the state. \$279 avg./per resident! This is down from 2021 \$343 avg/person
- b. Stabilize Inflation and supply lines and adequate employees to maintain business.
- c. Tillamook County incomes fell behind the statewide average by an additional \$1,789 over the 10 years, and had a 2022 average wage that was \$16,992 below the statewide average.
- d. Tourism and fishing to rebound with prosperity
- e. Protection from Forest fires; Sufficient rainfall for productive crops; Safe July 4th events

6. Government: Pray for our Nation ! Let Freedom Ring!

- a. Pray for your City Council by name – listed on page 3,4. We pray for all our leaders conduct to be above and not beneath, full of wisdom to solve problems, ears to hear and ability to think and speak clearly. Bring much needed unity& endurance
- b. Oregon State Rep. Cyrus Javadi, Suzanne Bonamici
- c. Oregon State Senator: Suzanne Weber
- d. County Commissioners: David Yamamoto, Mary Faith Bell, Erin Skarr
- e. County Leadership: Wisdom, strength, endurance to deal with many issues.
- f. All Leadership: (Pray for leaders in your city -page 3,4 Wisdom, unity, work as a team, favor with the people, accomplish God's purposes to meet city, county, state needs.
- g. Help Planning Commission negotiate State Regs. For housing and homelessness.

7. First Responders: Police, Search and Rescue, Fire and Ambulance

Praise: Tillamook Police Dept. is fully staffed.

- a. From Chief Rau:“Pray for Godly men & women to apply for positions in all agencies, leadership in Law enforcement to ask if their decisions would please God. For each First Responder to KNOW they make a difference, and that we never stop fighting for good.”
- b. Ambulance staffing is critically low. Need Drivers and Paramedics.
- c. Angelic Protection, wisdom & discernment of Police, First Responders, Firemen who answer all calls. Honor for our First Responders. Guard their minds & hearts from the trauma. Peace.
- d. Pray for strong marriages in high stress jobs.
- e. Criminals to be caught, detained, and have a heart change. Move away from catch& release
- f. Fire Departments/First Responders- plenty of volunteers needed in every city
- g. Search and Rescue, Water Rescue- protection of team, help them find missing people
- h. Jail: Shift atmosphere from darkness to light, protection for officers and inmates
- i. Angelic protection over our highways. Many fatal car accidents in 2023
- j. Help officers intervene effectively and quickly to thwart suicide attempts
