- e. 13 Abortions reported for the year third quarter. Pray for State of Oregon who has opened doors and tax payer funding to anyone wanting abortion even outside the state..
- f. The International Healing Rooms for Prayer have been set up in Garibaldi. Working on setting up a new team in Tillamook. Many praise reports.
- 4. Family: Praise: More housing solutions coming, More mini-homes for those transitioning out of homelessness.
 - a. Marriage Conference November 17, 18 at Living Water- all welcome \$130/couple
 - b. Restore divisions in families. Strengthen bonds of loyalty and peace. Put Christ at the center!

- f. Homelessness Estimate 2019 of 184 people in Tillamook Co., #2 in the state/capita Poverty,
- g. Housing shortages /Expensive Rent. 70.3% homes are occupied, the rest are vacation homes.

5. Business:

Praise: Beautiful new stores, upgrades in downtown Tillamook.

- a. Protection of our family farms and agricultural industries to maintain food supply for our area and country. Protection from regulations motivated by political agendas.
- b. Healthy family values to prevail in all businesses: In 2022 Tillamook Co. Marijuana sales are#6 in the state. \$279 avg./per resident! This is down from 2021 \$343 avg/person
- c. Stabilize Inflation and supply lines and adequate employees to maintain business.
- d. Tillamook County incomes fell behind the statewide average by an additional \$1,789 over the 10 years, and had a 2022 average wage that was \$16,992 below the statewide average.
- e. Tourism and fishing to rebound with prosperity Restore salmon and oyster beds
